

MAY 19TH PRE-ORDER FOR 2015–16 INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

Even though the General Assembly has not finalized the 2015-16 State budget the SCDE Instructional Materials' Office will process our second pre-order. As stated in the e-mail last week, the second pre-order will begin on Monday, May 19, 2015 and will close on Tuesday, May 26, 2015. During the March Instructional Materials Caravan, several teachers asked about ordering 3rd grade Cursive Writing materials for their 4th and 5th grade students that are not ready for the on-grade level materials. Unfortunately, we will not be able to facilitate this request because the ancillary or free-with-order materials will be based on the student materials ordered during the May 19th pre-order. The publishers will provide the ancillary materials that will be used in classrooms over the six-year life of the adoption according to the pre-order.

Please remind the schools in your district **do not dispose** of the old adoption materials until the new materials (includes ELA 9–12) arrive. After receiving the new materials, schools may dispose of the old adoption materials by recycling, giving materials to students, using as classroom reference materials, etc.
